

Withdraw plans to make Balabrooie Guest House a club, demands AAP

Heritage conservators also want the building to be left untouched

Brijesh Kalappa and members of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) have asked the government to withdraw its decision to convert the Balabrooie Guest House into a club.

Speaking to reporters on Friday, Kalappa, who recently joined the AAP, said the government decision to turn the guest house into a constitutional club for the MLAs would reduce its sanctity.

"The building has a history of 172 years and has trees hundreds of years old. Converting such

a structure as a club for MLAs threatens its sanctity," he said.

The club is unnecessary when the MLAs enjoy several other facilities, he said.

"They are paid Rs 60,000 as field allowance and Rs 50,000 as travel allowance. They also have Rs 20,000 as salary for a personal aide. It is condemnable that the

government intends to provide more luxurious facilities in the name of a constitutional club," Kalappa said.

Heritage conservators also suggest that the place should be left untouched.

"It is one of the oldest bungalows in the city and many important people who have contributed

greatly to the state and the country have stayed at the place. Since it is one of the oldest buildings, it also carries archaeological significance. Hence, it is important to preserve it," said Meera Iyer of Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH).

Open it to the public

While it would be a great relief if the building is preserved, she wanted the government to open it to the public.

"The public does not have access to many of the heritage structures in the city. It would be great if the government allows public access to this building at least," she said.

In October 2021, the state government had proposed to convert the building into a constitution club for legislators. Following the proposal, the Karnataka High Court had directed the government to maintain status quo with regard to the matter.

Caretaker steals gold, silver jewellery from retired DIG's house

A 45-year-old woman hired to care for a retired police officer made away with valuables worth Rs 6.7 lakh, including around 230 grams of gold jewellery and 750 grams of silver articles.

The accused Umadevi, a native of Shivamogga district, was working with the Sri Saibaba Health Care Service Agency and was employed in the house of Aparna M G, a resident of BDA Layout in Nagarabhavi and an assistant

director in the agriculture department.

Umadevi was hired a week before she stole the valuables to look after Aparna's father Ganganna (87), retired DIG (Prisons).

In her complaint to the Annapoorneshwari Nagar police, Aparna said Umadevi also stole a cheque leaf. Based on her complaint, police have registered a case of theft under IPC Section 381.

Umadevi was staying with Aparna's family. Around 9.30 am on September 21, Aparna

left for work. Around 4.30 pm, Ganganna called her to inform that Umadevi was not at home. He said the almirah door was open and he suspected some valuables were missing.

Aparna rushed back home to find five gold chains, two pairs of gold bangles, four pairs of earrings and around 750 grams of silver articles stolen, along with a cheque leaf signed for Rs 2.59 lakh.

Police have got clues about Umadevi's whereabouts and efforts are on to arrest her.

319 fresh Covid cases

BENGALURU, DHNS: Karnataka recorded 319 new Covid-19 cases on September 22, taking the state's active caseload to 3,061, according to the government's official bulletin released on Friday.

The day's test positivity rate stood at 1.53%. Of the 319 cases, 158 were recorded in Bengaluru. A total of 20,764 tests were conducted on the day. As many as 450 people were discharged, taking the total recoveries to 40,19,811.

BENGALURU, DHNS: Depressed over missing out on admission at a US university, a 22-year-old youth allegedly killed himself at Magadi town on Thursday, police said.

Sai Sanvit, son of businessman Kiran Kumar who had done BE in architecture from a reputed college in the city, took the extreme step when he was alone at home around 10 am.

With dreams of a foreign degree, Sanvit applied to a US university three months ago with his friends. Except Sanvit, all the others secured admission, and this disturbed him greatly.

He was found hanging from the ceiling using a sari as a rope. No death note was found. Magadi police filed a case of unnatural death.
