

Three Gehlot loyalists get notice; no clarity on party president election

With just three days left for filing of nominations, there is talk of a 'Plan B' among Gandhi family supporters; so far, only Shashi Tharoor and Pawan Bansal have collected nomination forms

mid the political crisis in Rajasthan, the Congress on Tuesday issued showcause notices to three loyalists of Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot for "grave indiscipline", and sought a reply within 10 days, but did not seek any action against Mr. Gehlot himself.

This keeps the possibility of Mr. Gehlot's candidature for the party's presidential election open, though there is no official word from him or the Congress on whether he would file his nomination. Only three days remain now for the nomination process to end on September 30.

So far, only Lok Sabha member Shashi Tharoor and party treasurer Pawan have collected

nomination forms for the October 17 election. Mr. Bansal, however, clarified that he had collected the form for the Chandigarh Pradesh Congress Committee and not for himself.

There is also talk of a "Plan B" among Gandhi family loyalists for the presidential election, with the names of leaders like Digvijaya Singh and Leader of the Opposition in Rajya Sabha Mallikarjun Kharge doing the rounds.

The show-cause notices were issued on the basis of a report – submitted to Congress president Sonia Gandhi by AICC general secretary for Rajasthan Ajay Maken, and Mr. Kharge - that blamed Cabinet Minister Shanti Dhariwal; Minister and Congress Chief Whip in the Assembly Mahesh Joshi; and Dharmendra Rathore, MLA, for Sunday's face-off.

Let EC decide Shinde's claim on 'real' Shiv Sena: SC

<u>Krishnadas Rajagopal</u>

In a blow to the Uddhav Thackeray faction, a Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court on Tuesday allowed the Election Commission (EC) to take a decision on Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde's claim that his faction represents the "real" Shiv Sena party.

The Bench led by Justice D.Y. Chandrachud rejected the Thackeray camp's plea to stay the EC proceedings under the Election Symbols (Reservation and Allotment) Order of 1968.

Reacting to the order later, in Gandhinagar, Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar told presspersons that the EC would follow the laid-down process while deciding on the matter. Mr. Thackeray's side argued in the court that the disqualification petitions against the Shinde faction were pending before the Speaker under the Tenth Schedule (anti-defection law) of the Constitution.

'Stay proceedings'

It said the EC proceedings should be stayed till the Bench decides questions of law referred to it, which include whether the dissent of Mr. Shinde's faction, without later forming a new party or merging with another, was a "split" from the original Sena.





Tale of vanishing lakes and drains that bring the city to its knees during rain

A year ago, in its report on 'Performance Audit of Management of stormwater in Bengaluru Urban Area', the Comptroller and Auditor General of India had exposed how the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike and other civic agencies had played a role in the deterioration of lakes and drains

ecent flooding in Mahadevapura zone and other areas, following heavy rain, exposed how the civic agencies failed miserably in protecting lakes and storm water drains.

A year before, in its report on 'Performance Audit of Management of stormwater in Bengaluru Urban Area', the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) had exposed how the BBMP and other civic agencies played their role in the vanishing of lakes and deterioration of storm water drains over the years.

No data

It revealed that the BBMP, which runs the tech capital of the country, does not possess fool-proof data on the total number/length and nature of different types of drains in its jurisdiction. The CAG also noted that there were "significant discrepancies in details pertaining to water bodies and storm water drains in master plans prepared by BDA and BBMP." The civic agencies ignoring encroachments of storm water drains, poor execu-



tion and 'undue' favours to contractors while executing storm water related works and many other derelictions were exposed in the report.

The report states that as per the information provided by the lake division of the BBMP, the city had 210 lakes in its jurisdiction out of which 66 lakes were yet to developed, 18 lakes with a total area of over 254 acres reported as disused lakes that include Chennamana Kere, Chikkalasandra, Lingarajapuram lakes, and others.

The report made a revelation that 41 and 51 water bodies, which existed in Koramangala and Vrishabhavathi valleys, respectively, as per the cadastral map (prepared through field

survey during early 1900s) were reduced to 8 and 13 by the year 2008 indicating the severity of lake conversion. Further, the wetland system (lakes, tanks, kere, and katte), which contributed about 479.48 ha (0.75%) and 215.46 ha (2.24%) to the geographical area of the valleys as per the cadastral map decreased to 262.37 ha and 62.05 ha during 2016/2017 indicating erosion due to land use changes.

As per the study, total length of drains as per cadastral maps (early 1900s) was 113.24 km and 226.29

Key recommendations

■ Formulation of comprehensive policy that recognises urban run-off as potential source of water requiring a clear plan of action for conservation in consonance with NDM

■ BBMP and BWSSB should jointly prepare plan of action to prevent sewage flow into storm-water drains, exploring letting treated water to water bodies in the city

■ Notifying revised masterplan to prevent encroachments of water bodies

■ BBMP to come up with action plan to recover cost amounts from contractors who have

violated norms and blacklist them. Action to be initiated against officials responsible for violations

■ State government should conduct detailed investigation into issues regarding preparation of incomplete and deficient DPRs, loss of files by SWD division, payments made under questionable circumstances, and take appropriate action based on the findings

■ BBMP needs to escalate efforts to conduct robust surveys to identify and evict all encroachments on SWDs, and maintain the stipulated buffer zone

km in Koramangala and Vrushabhavathi vallevs respectively, which was reduced to 62.84 km and 111.72 km by 2016/2017. In Koramangala Valley, which witnessed severe flooding, the length of two drains which merge before entering into Bellandur Lake was reduced from 338 m to 136 m between the years 2008 and 2016 which allowed constructions thereby affecting the free flow of storm water. In Vrishabhavathi valley, the drain passing along the border of Hosakerehalli lake remodelled and diverted to flow through the lake, thereby reducing the area of the lake.

In its observation on the status of storm water

drains in the city, the report states that rampant mixing (780MLD) with storm water is a serious problem. "Sewerage lines were drawn inside the SWDs and a large quantity of sewage was illegally let into SWDs. Untreated sewage is flowing into water bodies and affecting the quality of ground water. This carries substantial risk of spurt in vector/water borne diseasess," the report said.

The Chief Health Officer, BBMP, confirmed an outburst of cholera in the city during March 2020. The CAG report made several recommendations to fix the flooding problem in the city. However, it has been gathering dust.



Work on mini-Lalbagh in Jarakabande Kaval will begin soon, says Minister

There is no point in converting a forest into a park to cater to need for lung space. We should leave the forests as forests, say members of 'Save Jarakabande Kaval' campaign

facing strong opposition from local residents, farmers, and environmentalists, the State government has decided to go ahead with the plan to develop the Jarakabande Kaval deemed forest area in Yelahanka into a park, which is now being called "mini-Lalbagh", and is proposed to be named after former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee.

Responding to a question raised in the recently concluded Assembly session, Minister for Horticulture Munirathna said work on the project will begin soon. He defended the decision to develop a park in the area to cater to the demand for green spaces in a rapidly urbanising Benga-

"We need to acquire 307 acres of deemed forest land for the project. The proposal has been made and as per norms alternative land in 1:1 ratio has also been identified. Once we get a clearance from the Union Ministry of Environment and Forests, the project will begin in phases," he said, expressing confidence that they will get the MoEF clearance for transfer of land very soon. Alternative land patches have been identified in Shivalli (112 acres), Chennapura in Bengaluru Rural district (150 acres), Kotekoppa in Ramanagaram (100 acres), and in Chickballapura (30

acres), he said. The project has faced

opposition from residents environmentalists from the proposal stage. "There is no point in converting a natural forest, one of the last remaining patches in the city into a park to cater to the need for green spaces in the city. This will only disturb the natural ecosystem of the forest," said a volunteer

from "Save Jarakabande Forest".

However, local MLA S.R. Vishwanath claimed Jarakabande Kaval will remain a forest area and the trees will not be felled. "Only eucalyptus and

acacia trees which are not well suited for the region will be removed. Instead of them, we will plant fruit trees and other eco-friendly trees in phases. Thousands of people already come to the forest for walking and cycling. We just need to develop some infrastructure and retain the ecosystem. For example, in place of mud walking and cycling tracks, we will provide sturdier roads," he explained. He also said that to create environmental awareness among children, a centre will be established inside the forest. "A lot of forests have dis-

appeared in the city, especially in the northern part, in the last few decades. The trees in these forests were planted many generations ago and we should protect them. You cannot create a lung space by concretising a natural forest. These days, there is a bid to transform all the forests into a picnic spot where people can spend their or weekends or go cycling. But no one pays a thought about how a frog or a toad or another small creature could get trampled under bicycle wheels. The species inside forests are fighting for space. We should leave the forests as forests," said a member of the 'Save Jarakabande Forest' campaign.

'BBMP polls overdue, anomalies in ward reservation can't come in the way'

While the State government on Tuesday defended before the High Court of Karnataka the reservation of wards of the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) to various categories, the petitioners have alleged that reservation was "biased to suit political party in power" while also finding fault with the reservation of wards for Other Backward Classes (OBCs).

Meanwhile, the State Commission Election (SEC) said that elections cannot be postponed indefinitely while emphasising that only a week's time can be granted for the government to redo the reservation of seats for women if there is any discrepancies. Other anomalies in reservation for any other categories can't be considered for the present as the elections are overdue, the SEC contended citing the apex court's verdicts.

These arguments were made before Justice Hemant Chandangoudar during the hearing of the petitions challenging the notification issued by the government fixing reservation for 243 new wards of the BBMP.

The petitioners have sought stay on the reservation notification.

Population data

It was argued on behalf of some of the petitioners that a Commission, which was set up to identify castes that are politically backward and deserve political reservation, had recommended reservation for OBCs citing a data even



though no data of population of OBCs is available in the census 2011.

In some petitions, the legality of reserving all the wards under an Assembly constituency for women has been questioned while contending that wards for various categories should have been reserved Assembly-constituency wise.

Reserved wards

However, the government said that it has reserved 28 wards for SCs and four for STs based on the 2011 census, which states that there are 9,61,549 SCs and 1,55,080 STs of the total population of 84,49,004.

While the reservations of wards in favour of Backward Classes A, Backward classes B categories and women have been reserved by employing randomisation as the method, the reservation in favour of SCs and STs have been done in descending order of their population wardwise based on 2011 census, the government has stated.

Hearing adjourned

The court adjourned further hearing till September 28 while also asking the government's response on whether it wants to rectify the discrepancies, as pointed out by the petitioners, in a short period.

The petition will be submitted to the PM through the CM.



Panchaganga Express to operate till Madgaon

Konkan Railways has decided to operate Bengaluru-Karwar-Bengaluru Panchaganga Express till Madgaon in Goa from November 1, but as a different train with different numbers. Thus, there will be direct connectivity between Bengaluru and Madgaon through Karnataka Coast. Those intending to travel to Madgaon from Bengaluru or from Madgaon to Bengaluru, have to buy two tickets, one till Karwar and the other for the other leg of the journey. The Panchaganga Express (Train No. 16595/16596) does non-commercial run between Karwar-Madgaon-Karwar for fuelling and watering at Madgaon.

Man arrested for murdering wife over trivial row

The Begur police cracked the murder case of a 40-year-old homemaker who was found dead under mysterious circumstances at her house on Monday. The deceased has been identified as Sangeetha, wife of Manu, a private firm employee. The Begur police suspected that she was murdered due to some rivalry or for gain. But circumstantial evidence led them to suspect her husband Manu. The police picked up Manu and a detailed questioning led him to confess to the crime. Manu told the police that he married Sangeetha nine months ago and fought with her frequently over trivial matters. The couple had an argument on Sunday after Manu demanded food be prepared on the occasion of 'Pitru Paksha' but Sangeetha refused. Enraged, Manu strangulated her.

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

Is crackdown on PFI 'diversionary tactic', asks HDK

Urging the State government to come clean on the midnight arrests of PFI leaders and workers, former Chief Minister H.D. Kumaraswamy on Tuesday said that otherwise it would be construed as "diversionary tactics" of the government that is facing the PayCM campaign of the Congress.

Stating that such a crackdown in the State should not create fear, he told presspersons here, "It is not clear whether the midnight arrests by the police were based on police information or on the direction of the government." He said that if there is genuine information about anti-social elements, such information should be shared with people.

The statue has been sculpted by Ram Suthar from Noida.

Police crack down on PFI and SDPI activists, take 90 into preventive custody

These detentions follow the recent action against the two organisations across the country by the National Investigation Agency and police force of various States, including Karnataka

s many as 90 workers and office-bearers of Popular Front of India (PFI) and Social Democratic Party of India (SDPI) were taken into preventive custody across Karnataka

"In a special eight-hour operation carried out across the State from 3 a.m. to 11 a.m., as many as 90 people who could disturb public order have been detained," Alok Kumar, Additional Director General of Police, (Law and Order), said. Preventive detentions were made under Sections 107 and 110 of Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC), based on information that the person is likely to commit a breach of peace or disturb public tranquility.

These detentions follow the recent crackdown on PFI and SDPI across the country by the National In-

vestigation Agency and various State police forces including Karnataka. On Tuesday too, several State police forces cracked down on the members of the two organisations and made several arrests and preventive detentions. The State police raided several premises across eight districts of the State including Bengaluru, Dakshina Kannada, Hassan, Shivamogga, Belagavi and Yadgir.

Mr. Kumar said Tues-

day's action was based on specific by NIA and field level inputs by local police. A senior official said there was intelligence from Central agencies that workers of the two organisations were planning mega protests across the country, where they have a strong hold against NIA and police action later this week. "In-

telligence inputs suggest

that these protests could

turn violent. So preventive

detentions of the second

line of leadership of these organisations have been made to prevent a flare up," the official said.

Detainees were produced before the respective local tahsildars and asked to furnish two bonds and an undertaking to desist from participating in any form of violent protest. They were remanded into judicial custody for a week.

Husband of PSI scam accused gets bail

The Hindu Bureau KALABURAGI

The Kalaburagi Bench of the High Court of Karnataka, on Tuesday, granted bail to Rajesh Hagaragi, husband of Divya Hagaragi and president of Gyan Jyoti English Medium School, from where the malpractice and irregularities in the examination for the 545 Police Sub-Inspector posts were reported.

Earlier bail had been rejected for Rajesh Hagaragi, as he is the husband of Divya Hagaragi, the alleged kingpin in the PSI recruitment scam.

Judge M.G. Uma granted bail to Rajesh and cautioned him not to leave the jurisdiction without obtaining permission from the court and warned him against tampering with the

evidence. While public prosecutor Kiran Jawali opposed the bail, alleging that there are serious allegations against the applicant, senior advocate Avinash Uploankar and advocate Rajesh Doddmani argued that the court has granted bail to one of the accused Mallikarjun Melkundi, who was facing the similar charges as of the applicant.

After hearing the arguments of both sides, the court granted bail to Rajesh Hagaragi as there were no serious charges against him, except Section 212 of the IPC for harbouring a prime accused.

Investigation Officer, DY.SP Prakash Rathod, filed a 1,974-page chargesheet in connection with the scam and around 51 persons were arrested.

Educate officials on environmental laws with help of NLSIU, HC tells KSPCB Chairperson

The Hindu Bureau BENGALURU

Noticing procedural lapses by the officials of the Karnataka State Pollution Control Board in initiating prosecution for violation of environmental laws, the High Court of Karnataka has directed the board's chairperson to educate officials on these laws by taking the help of the National Law School of India University (NLSIU), Bengalu-

Also, the court directed

the board to to initiate action as per that law against a Deputy Environmental Officer (DEO) who was responsible for filing 'defective complaint' before the judicial magistrate against a stone crushing unit operator without following the mandatory provision in

Justice Suraj Govindaraj passed the order while quashing the criminal proceeding initiated in 2015 against B.V. Byregowda, proprietor of a stone crushing unit for violating certain provisions of the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, and the cognisance of offences taken by a judicial magistrate, Bengaluru Rural district.

The court found that the board in 2007 had delegated the power of filling cases under the provisions of the Air Act and the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, to the DEOs and Assistant Environmental Officers with a specific condition that cases have to be filed 'after getting approval from the Chairper-And this condition of

'getting approval from the Chairperson' is not a mere administrative formality but a statutory 'condition precedent' imposed as per the Section 15 Air Act, which allows imposing condition while delegating powers of the board to its

However, the court found that in the case the DFO had failed to take the approval of the Chairperson for prosecuting the petitioner, and the judicial magistrate too had not applied mind before taking cognisance of offences.

Observing that the board should take steps to ensure that cases are not quashed for want of following of procedure by its officials, the court directed the board's chairperson to submit the details of topics to be covered and materials to be provided to the officials while conducting workshops to educate and train them in environmen-



Tread carefully

Power to remove online content must be used sparingly, responsibly

he Government's order asking YouTube to remove 45 videos from 10 channels can be seen as a justified response to growing concern over the propagation of hate and communally sensitive material over the free video sharing website, but the frequent exercise of such a power is not without concerns. The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (I&B) has asked for the removal of the content in these videos based on intelligence inputs and the ostensible reasons are not limited to dissemination of hate against religious communities. They also relate to issues the Government considers "sensitive": references to Kashmir, the Agnipath scheme, and what it says are false claims about the rights of religious minorities being taken away and dissemination of material portending civil war. If these claims are true, and if the content transgresses the boundaries of free speech or threatens public order and security, such takedown orders may be justified. However, the manner of their passing remains an unrevealed process, as it is not known if the originators of the content were given an opportunity to explain their stand before the blocking orders were issued. Section 69A of the IT Act, which empowers the Government to block content, was upheld by the Supreme Court only after it noted that the rules provided procedural safeguards, including the need to issue notice to the originators or the intermediary, before a blocking order.

The latest order invokes the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021. It has a procedure by which an inter-departmental committee considers complaints on content and makes recommendations. The Authorised Officer has to take the approval of the Secretary, I&B, before directing the publisher or intermediary to block the relevant content. There is an emergency provision under which the Secretary may order content blocking as an interim measure, and thereafter confirm it after getting the committee's views. All such blocking orders are meant to be examined by a review committee, which ought to meet once in two months, but it is not known whether the panel meets regularly. The Government, which discloses how many videos it has got removed, must also reveal the outcome of such reviews, if any. India ranks quite high in the list of countries that make regular requests for removal of online content. There is no doubt that offensive content, as hate speech, incitement to violence and child pornography - posing a challenge to the dignified use of online space – ought to be removed. However, the power to block online content must be used sparingly and with sensitivity towards key freedoms and due process.

Silver lining

Indian cricket team in the shortest format is on a roller coaster

ndia's fluctuating Twenty20 fortunes jumped upwards recently against the visiting Australians. Sunday's triumph at Hyderabad helped Rohit Sharma's men stage a comefrom-behind 2-1 series victory. A pleasant outcome especially when juxtaposed with the grim backdrop that greeted the team in this particular series. Having failed to qualify for the Asia Cup final prior to hosting Australia, Rohit Sharma's men had many issues to address. To queer the pitch further, all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja was ruled out with an injury and resultant knee surgery. In a year that will soon witness the ICC T20 World Cup in Australia, every stumble in cricket's shortest format, both at the individual and team level, leads to the sharpening of knives besides triggering conspiracy theories. This being the 15th anniversary of M.S. Dhoni and company winning the inaugural ICC World T20, that glittering achievement and the subsequent title drought has only added to the pressure upon the Men in Blue. From that winning 2007 squad, only skipper Rohit and Dinesh Karthik are still part of the current squad, a testimony to their longevity besides being a pointer to the transitions that India underwent in its team composition over the last decade. And when India lost the opening T20 of the three-match series against Aaron Finch's men at Mohali, the worry lines stretched.

India's bowling, especially its fast bowlers, struggled; but the runs that Hardik Pandya and Suryakumar Yadav hustled offered some optimism as the caravan moved to Nagpur while dark clouds gathered. Eventually when the weather took a turn for the better, an eight-over-a-side contest was staged and in this micro-combat, India drew level. Rohit atop the batting tree and finisher Karthik, joined forces to get past a nervy chase. In an allegedly young man's game, it was the old guard that prevailed. And in the climax at Hyderabad, India reiterated its home credentials, humbling the Aussies while controlling the chase. Virat Kohli's form, Yadav's chutzpah and left-arm spinner Axar Patel's consistency all combined well to yield a fine win. If Jadeja was missed, Jasprit Bumrah's comeback was keenly watched. Even if the spearhead was not at his incisive best, he can only improve in the lead-up to the T20 World Cup. Catches being dropped is another blemish that India could well avoid as it chases glory. Just as Finch's men departed, South Africa arrived for a set of three T20s and three ODIs. The limited overs' preparation continues, as next year's ODI World Cup in India is another prize that the team will be under pressure to win.

Permanent membership of the UNSC is another story

here is a buzz in India about the prospects of the country becoming a permanent member of the United Nations Security Council. India's External Affairs Minister has been actively canvassing for the country's candidature, meeting his counterparts from several countries. He has repeated the call, made often in the past, for a text-based negotiation on what has been euphemistically referred to as the reform of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC), i.e., negotiation on a written document outlining the proposed reform instead of just holding forth

The five permanent members of the UNSC -China, France, the Russian Federation, the United Kingdom and the United States – constitute what is the last, most exclusive club in international relations. All other clubs have been breached. Until a quarter century ago, the nuclear weapon club had five members, the same five as the P-5. India, Pakistan, North Korea and Israel have since joined the club. The P-5 could do nothing to stop the latter countries from forcing themselves into membership of the nuclear club. But the permanent membership of the Security Council is another story.

Declarations that deserve scepticism

The inescapable fact is that none of the P-5 wants the UNSC's ranks to be increased. One or the other of them might make some noise about supporting one or more of the aspirants. Each is confident that someone among them will torpedo the enlargement of the club. Declarations of support for India's candidature need to be taken with a fistful of salt.

When delegations of 50 countries were drafting the Charter of the future United Nations at Dumbarton Oaks near Washington DC in 1944-45, the article regarding the Security Council, particularly the right of veto, was the subject of maximum debate and controversy.

There is considerable unhappiness among membership at large in the UN about the right of veto. The debate about veto is most often raked up when the western members of the P-5 club are not able to have their way. It is true that Russia, in its incarnations as the Soviet Union and the Russian Federation, has cast more vetoes (estimated to be 120 times, 'or or close to half of all vetoes') than the three western members of the club. But the western members have used their privileged position any number of times to protect Israel when the Palestinian question was being discussed. They also used veto to prevent sanctions being imposed on the apartheid regime of South Africa. There are no saints there.

India needs to be circumspect about veto. We ought to remember that the Russians have bailed India out on many occasions on the question of Kashmir. Most importantly, Russia helped India by vetoing unfavourable resolutions during the war of Bangladesh liberation in 1971. Looking ahead, we can never rule out the possibility of the Kashmir issue being raised in the Council at some time in the future. While we might expect, though not be certain of, Russia to come to our help, we must rule out either Britain or America from casting a negative vote against Pakistan. Going by the Chinese position of repeatedly blocking India's efforts to include confirmed Pakistani terrorists in the sanctions list, we can be sure of Chinese hostility towards us for a long

There are four declared candidates for permanent membership: India, Japan, Brazil and Germany, called the G-4. Africa and Latin America and the Caribbean are unrepresented in the permanent category at present. Africa's claim for two permanent seats has wide understanding and support, but the Africans have yet to decide which two countries these are to be. As for India, we can discount Pakistan's opposition; China will not support India nor will it ever support Japan. Brazil has regional opponents and claimants. As for Germany, Italy is firmly opposed to its claim. Italy has an interesting argument. If Germany and Japan – both Axis powers during the Second World War, and hence 'enemy' states – were to join as permanent members, that would leave out only Italy, the third founding member of the Axis group. In any case there are already three western nations among the P-5. Even if India enjoyed near universal support, there is no way

that India alone can be elected; it will have to be a package deal involving countries from other groups.

There is quite a debate going on about whether the aspiring countries should accept permanent membership without the right of veto. There is no ambiguity regarding the position of the P-5. Every one of them is firmly opposed to conferring the veto power to any prospective new permanent member. Not just the P-5. The vast majority of members do not want any more veto-wielding members in the Council. There is a proposal to the effect that a resolution can be defeated only by a negative vote of at least two permanent members. This also is a non-starter; the P-5 are firmly opposed to any dilution of their privileged position.

Changing the membership of the Council requires amending the Charter. This involves consent of two-thirds of the total membership of the U N, including the concurring votes of P-5. This means that each of the five has a veto. The Charter was amended once in the 1960s to enlarge the Council by additional non-permanent

Even now, if the proposal was to add a few non-permanent seats only, it would be adopted with near unanimity or even by consensus. It is the permanent category that poses the problem. One can have a good idea of the difficulty of amending the Charter by the fact that the 'enemy clause' contained in Article 107 of the Charter remains in it even though some of the enemy states such as Germany, Japan, Italy, etc. are very active members, often serve on the Council, and are close military allies of some of the victors in the war.

A new category is an idea worth considering A distinguished group of experts suggested a few years ago that a new category of semi-permanent members should be created. Countries would be elected for a period of eight to 10 years and would be eligible for re-election. India ought to give serious consideration to this idea.

Some experts are of the opinion that India should not accept permanent membership without the right of veto. "We cannot accept second class status", is what they say. First, nobody is offering India permanent membership. Second, membership with veto power should be firmly ruled out. If by some miracle we are offered or manage to obtain permanent membership without veto, we must grab it. Even a permanent membership without veto will be tremendously helpful in protecting our interests. For, there should be no illusion about how states view membership in the Council. It is all about national interest; nobody is there for any worthy cause such as human rights or even war and peace. India will be and should be no different.



Energising India-Nepal ties, the hydropower way

project (1,200 MW).

Much potential

n August 18, 2022, the Investment Board Nepal signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with India's National Hydroelectric Power Corporation (NHPC) Limited to develop the West Seti and Seti River (SR6) projects – a total of 1,200 MW.

Interestingly, nearly four years have passed since China's withdrawal from the project before Nepal decided to grant the project to India. Considering that hydro-power cooperation is a pillar in India-Nepal relations, there is a need to reflect on these questions: what does the decision offer to India and Nepal? What are the shared concerns and common interests? What are the options and alternatives?

Many hurdles

Historically, the 750MW West Seti Hydroelectric Project was thought of in the early 1980s as a 37 MW run-of-the-river scheme. Nepal issued the developing licence to France's Sogreah, which prepared a pre-feasibility study in 1987 proposing the scheme without building a dam.

With the project failing to see the light of the day, Australia's Snowy Mountains Engineering Corporation (SMEC) acquired a majority stake in the early 1990s. Between 1997-2011, attempts to make progress were affected due to investment and environmental concerns. Consequently, the China National Machinery and Equipment Import and Export Corporation stepped in in 2009, with SMEC holding a majority stake. However, China National Machinery and Equipment Import and Export Corporation withdrew citing a poor investment environment.

In 2011 Nepal revoked the licence of the West Seti Hydropower Company Limited in which SMEC had a majority stake, and handed it over to China. In an MoU in 2012, China's Three Gorges International Corporation was assigned to develop the project, but it withdrew in 2018, citing issues of resettlement and rehabilitation.

Subsequently, Nepal tried to develop the project by mobilising internal resources. However, increased costs resulted in further

India is already involved in the Mahakali Treaty (6,480 MW), the Upper Karnali Project (900 MW) and the Arun Three projects (900 MW) in western and eastern Nepal, respectively. This will also help India minimise the geopolitical influence of China and firm its presence in Nepal, considering that the West Seti Hydroelectric Project was a major Chinese venture under the Belt and Road Initiative. In a tilt towards India, Nepal's Prime Minister Sher Bahadur Deuba said, "We failed to invest in this project... Since India is reluctant to purchase energy produced by Chinese companies in Nepal, we will talk with PM Modi for the engagement of Indian developers."

The project has the potential to enhance cross-border power exchanges between the two

It is ironic that despite its huge hydropower potential, Nepal experiences power shortages during peak time, increasing its dependence on India to bridge the shortfall. With an estimated potential of 83,000 MW, Nepal's electricity exports to India are expected to increase foreign exchange and address the power shortage. It is estimated that if the hydropower potential is fully harnessed, Nepal can generate revenue to the tune of ₹310 billion in 2030 and ₹1,069 billion per year in 2045 by exporting electricity to India.

Similarly, India's severe deficit in coal-based thermal power plants in recent years, which meet

delays. Meanwhile, the project was remodelled as | 70% of India's electricity demand, has compelled the Government to arrange supplies through coal imports, accelerating the search for better alternatives. Given the growing energy demand, the West Seti Hydroelectric Project can provide an added alternative and viable way to address power deficits.

Steps to take

For the project to be successfully completed. options and alternatives need to be explored. First, the revised cost around the construction process has increased to \$2.04 billion. Since investment-related constraints have delayed the project, there needs to be a careful study of investment scenarios, particularly a conducive investment environment, distribution and transmission network and cost of resettlement and rehabilitation, at the preliminary stage.

Second, Nepal is concerned that the electricity rates and supply from India is inadequate to meet the rising demands. To address these concerns, the new MoU has already revised the percentage share of energy that Nepal will receive free of cost from the generation projects to 21.9% from 10% (Section 6.1) and provides for discussion 'in good faith for further modalities, including Section 6.1' to make it commercially viable (Section 6.2). Further, to address domestic demand, the MoU allows Nepal to request the NHPC to sell the power generated from the projects to the domestic market before selling whole or part to the export market (Section 8.2).

Third, the project can also be extended to other regional partners under the Bangladesh-Bhutan-India-Nepal (BBIN) framework for cross-border energy cooperation. For example, if the combined estimated hydropower potential in Nepal and Bhutan, along with the potential of Northeast India, is effectively harnessed, a cross-border energy market can be created and optimally operationalised. It will be a win-win at the bilateral and regional levels.

The lack of quality engineering education

he Union Ministry of Education released the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) rankings of 2022 in July. An analysis of the top 200 institutes of technology and engineering colleges presents a disquieting picture. The best institute in the category scored 90.04%. But the 50th best scored only 50.11%; the 100th best institute scored a mere 40.14%; and the one ranked 200th scored as little as 33.7%. One can imagine the situation of the remaining 1,049 institutions that applied but got no rank. And how terrible must be the situation in the approximately 4,500 institutions which did not even apply for the ranking?

These top-ranking institutions accommodate about 30,000 students as against the 11 lakh-12 lakh who register for the JEE Main exam. The odds to get a seat in one of the top 100 institutions are as low as 2.73%. Only 0.9% make it to one of the top 10 institutions.

Misleading headlines

Meanwhile, during the peak of the placement season, we keep seeing news about engineering graduates bagging job offers worth lakhs of rupees. Liberally embellished with encomiums like 'hard work pays' and 'institutions matter', these stories both entice prospective students and justify increasing fees. They rarely clarify that the reported packages are the rupee equivalent of U.S. salaries in dollars with no regard for the cost of living or for purchasing power parity. Those who get such placements know well that by U.S. standards, these salaries could only be regarded as decent.

They also know that their take-home salaries are only a fraction of what is mentioned in the headlines. A major proportion may comprise a sign-on bonus, a relocation allowance, restricted stock units (RSUs), and employee stock options plans (ESOPs). RSUs alone could constitute around 30% of the annual package but are typically paid over four years,

with only 5% and 15% paid in the first and the second year, respectively. What appeared to be ₹30 lakh would turn out to be only ₹1.5 lakh in the first year. Sign-on bonus is rarely paid upfront; instead, it is usually disbursed over about 24 months. The base salary component is only a fraction of the total package.

Placement headlines also rarely reveal that such offers are rare, limited to only a minuscule number of graduates, and are generally confined to international placements, mostly in the Information Technology sector. Of the about 30,000 students graduating from premier technology institutions, not more than 100 bag such offers.

But who bothers about such details? Most parents dream of ₹1 crore plus placements for their children, unmindful of the immense stress that they put their young ones through. This triggers a mindless rat race to get students into institutions of national importance. Students chase quality institutions, which, to them, are those that offer an assured placement, preferably with a dream package.

This, coupled with the scarcity of seats, makes a fertile ground for commerce to capitalise on. Coaching for entrance tests now commences from Class 9, if not earlier. Children are often forced to take time off from their studies to focus on admissions. In the process, they are robbed of their ambitions and passions. They are



forced to realise the dream that their parents and peers have seen for them and become doctors and engineers – not as much to serve society as to make big money. Dejection on the one hand and persistent peer pressure on the other cause anxiety, depression and even gives birth to suicidal tendencies.

Dearth of quality education But does this mean that India has a severe capacity constraint in engineering and technological higher education? Official data tell otherwise. The All-India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has already approved an adequate number of institutions in engineering and technology to admit at least 23.67 lakh students. That is twice the number of aspirants for engineering education. There is, thus, neither a scarcity of seats nor capacity constraints. The nation is, in fact, staring at a dearth of institutions offering quality engineering education at an affordable cost. In business parlance, that is the ability to deliver value for money.

A quick review of the data reveals that the task is daunting. AICTE has so far approved 5,926 institutions to offer programmes in engineering and technology. Of these only 1,249 (21.07%) came forward to get ranked under the NIRF in 2022. India probably doesn't need more institutions. The scope of enhancing the intake in the existing quality institutions also appears limited. What is needed is improvement in the overall quality of technical higher education across the board.

The youth are aspirational. Monetary rewards are a major attraction. But that does not mean that they are not orientated towards national development. Headline placements serve the purpose of sustaining such motivations. It is now for the nation to mitigate the widening gap between the best and the rest, and ensure equality of opportunity in access to quality technical higher education.

The AAP's economic challenge in Punjab

Freebies and mounting debt may prove costly for the State and AAP

arlier this month, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP)led Punjab government failed to pay salaries to its employees on time. This led to questions on financial prudence and, specifically, the AAP's pre-poll promises of providing 'freebies'.

The AAP government has completed six months in Punjab. The government began giving 300 units of free electricity to every household from July 1, which is expected to place an additional burden of ₹1,800 crore on the State exchequer. As per the State's annual budget, a total power subsidy bill of ₹15,845 crore has been proposed compared to the ₹13,443 crore in 2021-22. One of the AAP's key pre-poll promises, of giving financial assistance of ₹1,000 to all women aged 18 and above every month, is yet to be implemented. There are close to one crore women voters in Punjab. This means the cost of fulfilling this promise would amount to some ₹12,000 crore per annum.

The salaries of government employees were delayed by a week for August. Usually, government employees receive salaries by the first of every month for the previous month. Sources said a reason for the delay could be that the five-year compensation for States under the GST regime has ended. During the last financial year, Punjab received around ₹15,000 crore in GST compensation from the Centre.

On September 7, soon after government employees warned that they would go on strike if payment of salaries was delayed any further, the Punjab government released about

₹3,400 crore and paid salaries to Class A and Class B employees. Class C and Class D employees were paid the previous day. Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema said salaries were delayed as the State was gearing up for the revival of the special drawing facility.

Punjab's 2022-23 budget shows that the effective outstanding debt of the State stood at ₹2.63 lakh crore (45.88% of GSDP). In addition, State agencies, State-level undertakings, boards, and corporations have a debt of close to ₹55,000 crore, of which about ₹22,250 crore has been guaranteed by the State government. A white paper brought out by the current government after coming to power stated that the debt indicators of the State are probably the worst in the country. Mr. Cheema said Punjab was reeling under a financial mess when the AAP came to power, but now the government is doing everything it can to improve the financial health of the State while also fulfilling its promises to the people.

According to the State budget, the government is expecting the State's revenue receipts in 2022-23 to increase by 17.08% compared to 2021-22, contributing ₹95,378 crore to the State exchequer, with new policies, including the excise policy. It also expects a buoyancy of about 27% in GST collections in FY 2022-23 by plugging loopholes in GST collections, which would add some ₹4,350 crore more to the State's kitty. But the

State's earnings are proposed at ₹95,378 crore against an expenditure of ₹1,55,860 crore.

Economists say there seems to be no road map to revive the State's economy. "If we take into account all the subsidies and freebies and committed expenditures, debt servicing, the interest payments, free electricity, the free bus service for women (during the Congress regime), etc., it consumes 116% of the budgeted revenue. Last year, the budgeted revenue was ₹95,000 crore and collection was ₹78,000 crore. Even if this government collects ₹95,378 crore, which is next to impossible, subsidies will still consume 116% of the revenue," said Raniit Singh Ghuman, Professor of eminence (Economics) at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar

The government has also refrained from imposing new taxes. In the budget, it has proposed to raise loans to the tune of ₹35,000 crore in the ongoing financial year. The government is meeting the current account expenditure by taking loans; it is repaying loans and interests by taking loans; and also paying for freebies by taking loans. It is clear that Punjab is being pushed deeper and deeper into a debt trap.

Senior government officials asserted that while there is no immediate cause for concern regarding finances, in the long run there is bound to be anxiety given the increasing number of 'freebies' and the debt position of the State. The sixth Punjab Finance Commission report, submitted in March, pointed out that a plethora of election promises will further aggravate the crisis, and impair governance and economic growth. While the debt may not be the AAP's contribution alone, the lack of serious reforms may prove costly for the State and for the AAP.

An attempt to get the Indian Railways back on track

Adding more AC III tier economy class coaches is a step in the right direction

The Indian Railways' experiment to introduce AC III tier economy class coaches has started to pay off. Since its introduction, in the last one year, these coaches have earned the Railways more than ₹230 crore in revenue by ferrying around 21 lakh passengers. Fares in AC III tier economy are 6%-7% cheaper than the AC III tier class. The economy class has a capacity of 83 berths compared to 72 in the

regular coach. Only 370 such coaches have been used so far, but with demand picking up, the Railways has planned to add more such coaches. Data suggest that adding more AC III tier economy class coaches is a step in the right direction. In recent years, the operating margin of the Indian Railways has taken a beating. Latest data show that the Railways spends ₹98 to earn ₹100. It has consistently failed to meet the expected revenue internally, and its reliance on extra-budgetary resources such as funds from LIC and market borrowings has significantly increased.

Chart 1 shows the operating ratio (OR) of the Railways in the last 12 years. OR measures the amount spent by the Railways to earn ₹100. Between FY09 and FY16, OR ranged from 90% to 95%. But between FY17 and FY20, it ranged from 96% to 98%. In other words, the Railways was spending ₹98 to earn ₹100.

Chart 2 shows the share of internal revenue, extra budgetary resources and gross budgetary support in the total revenue receipts of the Railways. The share of internal resources in total revenue receipts fell from 79% in FY15 to 53% in FY20, while reliance on extra budgetary resources to raise funds rose from 5% to 26% during the

The AC III tier is the only class of

service which has generated consistent profits for the Railways. Between FY16 and FY20, AC III tier coaches carried only 1% of the total passengers, but were responsible for 21% of the earnings from travellers. Such a low-passenger, high-revenue dichotomy was not seen in any other class. On the other hand, a high-passenger, low-revenue dichotomy was seen in the inexpensive classes. For instance, over 90% passengers travelled by second class which accounted for only 37% of the earnings. **Table 3** shows the relevant data for all classes of service.


While the first AC and second AC coaches also ferry a smaller share of passengers, their share in earnings was far lower than AC III tier. While the average rate charged per passenger per kilometre in first AC, second AC and executive AC coaches was higher than AC III tier, their share in total earnings was lower. And so, AC III tier stands out. It is not as expensive as the other AC classes and at the same time, its share in revenue has not been impacted by the relatively low pricing.

Table 3 also shows the classwise share in passenger kilometres. One passenger kilometre is the equivalent of transporting

one passenger over one kilometre. **Table 4** further brings out the uniqueness of AC III tier. It shows operational losses (in ₹crore) incurred while operating various classes of service. A negative figure points to losses incurred. For instance, in operating AC first class service, the Railways incurred a loss of ₹403 crore in FY20. In contrast, the Railways made a profit of ₹65 crore by operating AC III tier coaches. The table shows that AC III tier was the only class which made profits in the FY13-FY20 period, while all the other classes except AC chair car posted losses. So, the move to introduce an economy version of AC III tier may help the Indian Railways get back on track. With inputs from Yuthika Bhargava

FIFTY YEARS AGO SEPTEMBER 28, 1972

Durable world peace if elected again

New York, Sept. 27: President Nixon said last night his overtures to China and the Soviet Union had changed the world and he needed another four years in the White House to finish the task of building a durable world peace. The President, elected by a majority of only a few hundred thousand votes in 1968, told 1,500 cheering Republicans at a fund-raising dinner he wanted a massive majority over Democrat George McGovern in November so that he could have an uncontested mandate in foreign and domestic affairs. Speaking at the end of the first day of a three-day campaign swing in New York and California, the country's most populous States, Mr. Nixon suggested that Senator McGovern's proposals – including a slash of more than \$30,000 millions in the Defence budget would undo all he had achieved since he entered the White House in 1969. And the President made it clear he was determined to build on the successes of his Moscow Summit last May by seeking peaceful co-existence with the Soviet Union even at the risk of alienating Jewish voters demanding action to force the Kremlin to rescind the heavy exit visa fees it had imposed on Russian Jews wanting to emigrate to Israel. Mr. Nixon urged American Jews enraged over Soviet policy not to push him into a confrontation with the Soviet Union. His appeal also appeared to be directed at Senator McGovern, who has endorsed moves in Congress to withhold most-favoured-nation tariff treatment, part of a proposed big trade package from the Soviet Union until the Kremlin permits Russian Jews to leave for Israel without paying the exit visa fee.

A HUNDRED YEARS AGO SEPTEMBER 28, 1922 German trade

London, Sept 27: Mr. S.M. Mitra, Indian journalist, writing in the "Daily Telegraph" draws attention to the rapidity of German commercial expansion in India which in the past 10 months has practically driven out Japanese goods from India. He says Hindu Mohomedan and Parsi shops are full of German merchandise and Germany is organising despatch of goods from India by the Younghusband route to Tibet. Mr. Mitra believes a large volume of the trade in India will pass into German hands if British manufacturers do not start an organisation to combat German expansion.

Three Gehlot loyalists get notice in Rajasthan

After a meeting at her 10 Janpath Road residence to finalise candidates for the Assembly election in Himachal Pradesh, Ms. Gandhi discussed the issue of the Rajasthan crisis with Congress leaders Ambika Soni and Anand Sharma. Sources said Mr. Gehlot was to speak with the Congress president to clarify his position, but there was no confirmation if the conversation had taken place. The Hindu has learnt that the Chief Minister spoke with Mr. Sharma and Sunday's events were discussed.

On a day of fast developments, former Rajasthan Deputy Chief Minister Sachin Pilot's arrival in Delhi led to speculation that he could soon meet the party's top leadership. The issue of change of guard in Rajasthan and the Congress's presidential elections are linked as the Gandhi family had informally endorsed Mr. Gehlot as the party's main presidential candidate and had planned to appoint Mr. Pilot as his successor to head the government.

"Prima facie, the above charges are an act of grave indiscipline. Therefore, this show-cause notice is being issued seeking your reply within 10 days as to why disciplinary action not be taken against you as per the provisions of the constitution of the Indian National Congress," read the notice issued by general secretary Tariq Anwar, a member of the party's disciplinary committee.

'Let EC decide Shinde's claim on 'real' Shiv Sena'

A "split" from the original political party without a subsequent merger with another party or formation of a new faction is not a defence under the Tenth Schedule since January 1, 2004. But Justice Chandrachud said it was a "bit of a problem" to accept the argument that proceedings before a constitutional authority like the EC should be "stultified" merely for the fact that questions about the disqualification proceedings were referred to a Constitution Bench.

"There is the Symbols Order which contemplates that there could be more than one faction of a political party. Now, the Symbols Order governs a political party. The ambit of the disqualification provisions of the Tenth Schedule is the legislature party. The Speaker, in the course of deciding whether there is a case of disqualification or not, cannot decide which group of persons form the wider political party..." Justice Chandrachud said.

Mr. Rajiv Kumar said the EC would apply the transparent process of the "rule of majority" while taking the decision on the plea of the breakaway faction.

Over 170 PFI activists detained across India

These were based on Intelligence inputs and the information gathered during the first National Investigation Agency-led (NIA) clampdown on 15 States on September 22. During the previous operation, 109 persons were arrested.

On Tuesday, about 25 PFI activists were arrested from different parts of Assam, while 25 were held from Maharashtra's Aurangabad, Thane, Nanded, Parbhani, Malegaon and Amravati. Various wings of the Uttar Pradesh Police took into custody over 55 people following raids in 26 districts. The police in Madhya Pradesh detained 21 people from Bhopal, Ujjain, Indore, Neemuch and other parts of the State; and 10 were detained in Gujarat for questioning.

In Kerala's Palakkad, the police searched the PFI offices and the houses of its leaders and functionaries at Kalmandapam, Chadanamkurissi, BOC Road, and Sanghuvarathodu. The houses of some Social Democratic Party of India (SDPI) leaders were also covered. The police in Mananthavady (Kalpetta) seized swords from a tyre shop allegedly belonging to a PFI activist, who is yet to be traced. The Delhi Police detained 30 persons from various places.

Some more detentions were reported from Karnataka's Dakshina Kannada and Udupi. (With inputs from different bureaus and PTI)

Govt. app to capture data on groundwater

To ensure transparency, the officers assigned for the task have been told to upload the geotagged photographs through the app each time the measurement is done.

n a first, three sepa-Constitution Bench proceedings in the Supreme Court were simultaneously beamed live through YouTube on Tuesday. "Statistics show that more than eight lakh viewers watched the proceedings before the three Constitution Benches. Truly, a historic day," the Public Relations Office said in a statement.

The Benches were led by Chief Justice U.U. Lalit, Justices D.Y. Chandrachud and Sanjay Kishan Kaul, respectively. Justice Chandrachud, who is the chairperson of the court's ecommittee and the driving force behind the livestreaming project, said in court that "this is a work in progress". "This step will go a long

way in overcoming the barriers of distance and provide to citizens from every nook and corner of the country an opportunity to watch the court proceedings. Attempts will now be made to live-stream proceedings in all important matters," the statement said. The cases heard included the challenge to the 10% quota for EWS before the CJI's Bench. Justice

A Full Court meeting of apex court judges on September 20 had resolved to live-stream the Constitution Bench hearings from September 27.

Live-streaming has become a reality nearly four years after the court's Swapnil Tripathi judgment of 2018. The judgment had upheld the plea for livestreaming of its proceedings. The court had said live-streaming would "virtually" expand the court beyond the four walls of the courtroom. "Livestreaming of court proceedings has the potential of throwing up an option to the public to witness live court proceedings," the court had said.

SC reserves verdict on petition against **EWS reservation**

A five-judge Bench of the Supreme Court led by Chief Justice of India (CJI) U.U. Lalit on Tuesday reserved for judgment petitions challenging the validthe 103rd of Constitutional Amendment which provides 10% reservation in government jobs and educational institutions to the economically weaker sections or EWS, but excludes the 'poorest of poor' among Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes from its ambit.

The Bench heard marathon arguments for seven days on the vital issue whether the EWS quota, solely based on economic criterion, violated the basic structure of the Constitution. The petitioner argued that the amendment was contrary to the equality code. The court asked the Centre whether the reservation encroached on the opportunities of meritbased candidates.

The government maintained that the 10% quota was not an addition to the



50% ceiling on reservation. It said the quota was an "independent compartment". The court had questioned whether it would take a piece of the pie from the 50% available to non-reserved or open category who compete purely on the basis of merit. The court had also questioned the exclusion of backward classes.

Dr. Mohan Gopal, in his rejoinder, said this was the first time that being a member of the forward classes was made a pre-requisite for getting government assistance. Advocate Kaleeswaram Raj submitted that fundamental rights are individualistic and the government's justification for excluding SC, ST and OBC on the ground that they already take benefit of the 50% quota does not hold water.

At state funeral in Tokyo, Modi recalls Abe's vision for a free, open Indo-Pacific

Strengthening the Indo-Pacific region, a concept first articulated by former Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, was at the top of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's discussion with Japan's current Prime Minister Fumio Kishida in Tokyo on Tuesday.

Mr. Modi, along with several heads of state and government, attended Mr. Abe's funeral in the Nippon Budokan arena, where Mr. Kishida and his predecessor, Yoshihide Suga, offered emotional tributes to their former leader, who was assassinated in July.

A total of 20,000 policemen were deployed at the ceremony attended by nearly 4,300 people. Security arrangements were stepped up due to recent protests over the Kishida government's decision to accord the former Prime Minister a state funeral, which the Opposition parties called overly expensive

and out of step with tradition in Japan which reserves the honour for the royal family. Only once in the past - in 1967 - was a state funeral accorded to a Prime Minister.

Mr. Modi offered flowers at the funeral, and later met Mr. Abe's widow, Akie Abe, and offered condo-

"When I was in Tokyo earlier this year, little did I imagine I would be back for the solemn programme of former PM Abe's state funeral. He was a great

leader, a phenomenal individual and someone who believed in India-Japan friendship. He shall live on in the hearts of millions," Mr. Modi tweeted about Mr. Abe, whom he had known for several years, and had last met in May when he had gone to attend a Quad summit.

Among the dignitaries at the funeral were the Prime Ministers of Australia and South Korea, the President of Vietnam and U.S. Vice-President Kamala

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, who was due to be the only G-7 country leader present, cancelled plans at the last minute due to floods in Canada, and his Industry Minister attended instead.

Apart from the bilateral meeting with Mr. Kishida, Mr. Modi met Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese at the Akasaka palace event in the evening.

Bilateral meeting

"Prime Minister [Modi] noted the contributions of late Prime Minister Abe in strengthening India-Japan partnership as well in conceptualising the vision of a free, open and inclusive Indo-Pacific region," said the Ministry of External Affairs in a statement about the bilateral meeting between Mr. Modi and Mr. Kishida on Tuesday morning.

Speaking at the funeral, Mr. Kishida spoke of Mr. Abe's vision of the Indo-Pacific, which he had first outlined in a speech he

gave in the Indian Parliament in 2007. "You who advocated 'the confluence of the two seas' deepened that concept further, cultivating it to become the framework of a 'free and open Indo-Pacific' that encompasses many countries and includes massive numbers of people," said Mr. Kishida, who served in Mr. Abe's Cabinet during both his prime ministerial tenures (2006-07 and 2012 tr 2020).

"You not only markedly strengthened our ties with the United States and dramatically reinforced Japan-U.S. deterrence but also enhanced our cooperation with India and Australia to form the Quad framework, based on reasoning you had long promoted."

In a mark of growing tensions with China, the Japanese government hosted a high-power delegation from Taiwan at the state funeral, and included Taiwan's name on the list of floral tributes from various countries read out.

Justice Abhijit Gango padhyay also directed former West Bengal Board of Primary Education (WBBPE) president Manik Bhattacharya to appear before the CBI on Tuesday. The court said in case Mr. Bhattacharya fails to appear before the CBI, the agency can take him into custody. Meanwhile, Mr. Bhattacharya approached the Supreme Court which gave him a reprieve for a day. Around 20 lakh candidates appeared for the examination in 2014.

Army deploys medium, long-range weapons across northern border

Since the standoff with China along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Eastern Ladakh in May 2020, the Army has deployed its entire range of mediumrange artillery guns and long-range rockets in the region to augment its long range fire power as part of the reorientation towards the northern borders. The Army is now in the process of procuring another 100 K9-Vajra howitzers, which has already been approved by the Defence Ministry.

The Regiment of Artillery is also in the process of inducting loitering mutations, while it is also looking at procuring tactical **Unmanned Aerial Vehicles** (UAV). "Induction of Dhanush, K-9 Vajra and M777 Ultra Light Howitzers

(ULH) has enhanced reach of artillery firepower. Operationalisation of Pinaka Multi-Rocket Launch System (MRLS) has added punch to long range capability of artillery firepower," a defence source said. The Regiment is celebrating the 196th Gunners Day on September 28.

The source added that in the next five years, majority of these inductions should near completion, barring any slippages in delivery schedules. On this note, the source stressed on the need to upscale the capacities and capabilities of the domestic industry and the need to evolve a "conglomerate or consortium culture". The Army plans to con-

vert all its artillery regiments to medium range by converting it to 155 mm standard. The process of completing the mediumi-

sation process is likely to be achieved sometime around 2040, the source stated. Further, the Regiment of Artillery is looking at procuring tactical UAVs, unlike the Medium Altitude Long Endurance UAVs operated by the Army Aviation, to enable Observation Post (OP) officers to better direct fire power and also to carry out post strike damage assessment at long ranges.

Ground based surveillance has limitations and so we are looking at mini-UAVs of two types which are capable of vertical take-off and landing, sources explained. These include UAVs capable with range of 15-20 km and and endurance of upto two hours and those with slightly longer range of of 80km with endurance of

four hours.

Carl-Gustaf M4 may be produced in India, says Sweden's SAAB

Swedish defence major SAAB on Tuesday announced plans to manufacture its Carl-Gustaf M4

weapon system in India. The manufacturing would be done by a new fully SAAB-owned subsidiary, Saab FFV India Pvt. Ltd. "This is the first time, we will be setting up a manufacturing facility for this outside Sweden," said Gorgen Johansson, senior vice president, SAAB, in an interaction with the media. "We will transfer the technology to India. The first product will roll out in 2024," he said.

However, they are yet to receive the government approval for the new venture, Mr. Johansson said, while declining to give details on

the volume of investment and the production capacities planned. The location of the new facility is yet to be decided and they will have competition for it, he added.

The Indian Army has already ordered the M4 version, he said in response to a question. Mr. Johansson said the company would first meet requirements of the Indian forces, and later look at exporting the sub systems to Sweden from where they would go into the global supply chain.

The new facility would be partnering with Indian sub-suppliers which will fulfil the 'Make in India' requirements, he stated.

The Army has been using the iconic Carl-Gustaf since 1976 and currently operates the Mk2 and Mk3 versions.

MLA questions Gehlot's leadership capacity

The Osian MLA is the granddaughter of Parasram Maderna – a popular Jat leader who headed the CLP in 1998. Maderna was overlooked to make Mr. Gehlot the Chief Minister.

"Let's believe that he [Mr. Gehlot] didn't know about the brewing rebellion. But at 7 p.m. when he did not find the legislators at his residence where the CLP meet was organised, why didn't he pick the phone and summon them? This definitely raises a question on his leadership

How do you view the developments in the Rajasthan Congress and

the State government? If you look at the background just before 2018, before the Congress government was formed, Sachin Pilot was the Congress president and Ashok Gehlot was just a senior leader. It was said about Ashok Gehlot that he was a man of 24/7, 365 days a year

politics. At that time there was suspense as to who would be the Chief Minister, and even when Gehlot took the oath, there were slogans in the Rai Bhavan cheering two CMs – Ashok Gehlot

and Sachin Pilot. When the Ministry was formed, there were differences, there were fights over allotment of office space in the Secretariat. Then came the July 2020 events, when the Sachin Pilot group openly revolted and the whole government was sequestered in resorts for 50 days.

For four years, the Congress high command did nothing to repair or even address this scatter in their ranks. So what has happened is a manifestation of the internal contradictions within the Congress, and it will not reduce anytime soon.

The party has a government only in two States -Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh - and are unable to handle a big State like Rajasthan. What Bharat Jodo Yatra? They need to get their party together.

Are you anticipating early polls?

Tharoor facing steep challenge from Kerala Congress colleagues

Thiruvananthapuram MP Shashi Tharoor apparently faces a steep challenge in winning over Kerala Pradesh Congress Committee (KPCC) colleagues in his bid to win the All India Congress Committee presidential election.

Pressed further for a response on whether he would shoulder the responsibility if entrusted with it, Mr. Baghel reiterated that he considered himself "junior".

Ashok Gehlot – Mr.

Baghel's Rajasthan counterpart and the only other Congress Chief Minister in the country – is likely to contest against former Union Minister Shashi Tharoor for the top post. legislators However,

loyal to Mr. Gehlot have rebelled against the purported move of the Congress high command to appoint Sachin Pilot as his successor for the Rajasthan Chief Minister's post.

Mr. Baghel aug the "lack of internal democracy" in the BJP when it came to that party's presidential election. It is

widely anticipated that BJP president J.P. Nadda, who will complete his threeyear tenure in February 2023, will get an extension.

"The whole country knows that the Congress is holding election but in the BJP, elections are over and no one got to know. What kind of a democracy is this? Two individuals [a reference to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah] made [him the party president] and he [Mr. Nadda] got a second tenure... There was no meeting, voting or election date," he said.

Amid protest, AAP moves 'confidence motion' in Punjab **Assembly**

The Punjab Assembly witnessed noisy scenes on Tuesday as the ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) moved a confidence motion, even as the Opposition termed 'Operation Lotus' a figment of imagination of the AAP government, created to deflect attention from the real issues concerning people of Punjab.

The MLAs of the Congress, the BJP and the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) opposed the move to bring the confidence motion. The two BJP MLAs - Ashwani Sharma and Jangi Lal Mahajan - walked out of the House. The Congress MLAs led by Leader of the Opposition Partap Singh Bajwa condemned the move, terming it as challenging the authority and power of the Governor. He said it in reference to the Governor's recent denial of permission to convene a special session of the House only for bringing a confidence motion.

After moving the motion, Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann said the Congress and the BJP were two sides of the same coin, adding that the confidence motion had been necessitated as both parties had joined hands to topple the democratically elected government in the State. "BJP is using anti-defection law as a new tool to form governments through back door in the country and unfortunately despite of being its worst victim, the Congress is supporting it," he said.

Collegium suggests Dipankar Datta's elevation as SC judge

The Supreme Court Collegium has recommended to the government the elevation of the Chief Justice of the Bombay High Court, Dipankar Datta, as a judge of the court. The resolution was made at a meeting of the Collegium, led by Chief Justice of India U.U. Lalit, on Monday. Justice Datta was elevated as a permanent judge of the Calcutta High Court on June 22, 2006. He became the Chief Justice of the Bombay High Court on April 28, 2020. His elevation is the first recommendation made by the Collegium led by Chief Justice Lalit. The Supreme Court's judicial strength is currently 29, including the CJI. The sanctioned strength is 34.

CBI arrests Vijay Nair in Delhi Excise Policy case

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) on Tuesday arrested Vijay Nair, former chief executive officer of Mumbai-based Only Much Louder, in connection with the Delhi Excise Policy case. The agency had earlier issued lookout notices against Mr. Nair and seven other private persons accused of irregularities in the Delhi government's now-withdrawn excise policy. The CBI has alleged that irregularities were committed while modifying the Excise Policy, undue favours were extended to licence holders, licence fee was waived or reduced and L-1 licence was extended without the competent authority's approval.

Bench to consider questions of law on demonetisation

A Constitution Bench led by Justice S. Abdul Nazeer will hear on Wednesday a reference to test the legality of a November 8, 2016 notification on the demonetisation of ₹500 and ₹1,000 currency notes and the government's implementation of the policy. The questions of law include whether the RBI notification and the "limited withdrawal" of one's own money were violations of Articles 14 (right to equality), 19 (freedom of speech, trade, occupation, etc.), 21 (fundamental right to protection of life) and 300A (right to property) of the Constitution.

Hearing on Nov. 9 in petition related to Delhi-Centre row

A Constitution Bench led by Justice D.Y. Chandrachud on Tuesday agreed to start hearing from November 9 the dispute between the Centre and Delhi government for control over bureaucrats in the Capital. In May, a three-judge Bench led by Chief Justice Ramana had referred to a Constitution Bench the limited question concerning 'services' or bureaucracy for an authoritative pronouncement.

The National Capital Territory government had compared its predicament without power over the 'services' like that of a king without a

Jobs grew in final quarter of last fiscal, manufacturing is largest contributor: survey

Estimated employment in nine non-farm sectors rose from 3.14 crore during September-December 2021 to 3.18 crore in January-March 2022, says Labour Minister Bhupender Yadav; marginal increase in participation of women workers

anufacturing continues to be the institulargest tional employer in the country, employing about 38.5% of the workers, according to the fourth (January-March 2022) of the Quarterly Employment Survey (QES), which is a part of the All India Quarterly Establishment based Employment Survey (AQEES)

The survey, which was released by Union Labour Minister Bhupender Yadav here on Tuesday, estimated that around 3.18 crore workers were employed in about 5.31 lakh establishments between January and March. It claimed an increase of about four lakh workers compared with the third round of QES, which was done for the last three months of 2021.

Education, manufacturing, trade and financial services together accounted for 84% of the total estimat-

Rise in jobs

An estimated total of 3.18 crore workers were found to be engaged in 5.31 lakh establishments during the 4th round (January-March, 2022) of the Quarterly Employment Survey, compared to a total of 3.14 crores in the third quarter

ed units. "Manufacturing sector accounts for the largest percentage (38.5%) of the total number of workers, followed by education sector with 21.7%, IT/BPO sector with 12% and health sector 10.6%," the survey said. Almost 80% of the establishments engaged 10 to 99 workers. About 12% of the establishments reported fewer than 10 workers. Only 1.4% of the establish-

ments surveyed reported

at least 500 workers. "Such large establishments were mostly in the IT/BPO sector and in the health sector," the report said.

The participation of women workers witnessed a marginal increase from 31.6% in the third quarter to 31.8% in the fourth quarter report. However, women workers constituted about 52% of the workforce in the health sector, while the corresponding percentages in education, financial services and IT/ BPO sectors stood at 44%, 41% and 36%, respectively.

"It is noteworthy that in financial services, women far outnumber males among self-employed persons," the report added.

The survey said 86.4% of the workers were regular employees, and 8.7% were contractual employees followed by casual employees (2.3%) and self-employed

(2%). "The share of fixed term employees in the establishments was found to be the least (0.7%) over all," the survey said.

Releasing the report, Mr. Yadav said employment was showing an increasing trend and estimated employment rose from 3.14 crore in the third quarter (September-December 2021) to 3.18 crore in the fourth quarter (January-March 2022). "It is important to mention here that the total employment in these nine selected sectors taken collectively was reported as 2.37 crore in the sixth economic census (2013-14)," he said.

The Labour Bureau had taken up AQEES to provide quarterly estimates about employment and related variables of establishments in both organised and unorganised segments of nine sectors – manufacturing, construction, trade, transport, education, health, accommodation and restaurant, IT / BPO and financial services.

Mr. Jaishankar had told The Hindu in April this

year at a press conference following the India-U.S. 2+2 Ministers meeting in Washington DC that people were entitled to have their views on India but that India was equally entitled to views on their views and the "lobbies" and "vote banks" driving those views. Presumably he was referring to some U.S. Members of Congress voicing concerns

over human rights in India and pressing the Biden administration on the issue.

Mr. Blinken, in his remarks which preceded Mr. Jaishankar's on Tuesday, said both countries were striving to form " a more perfect union". "This is a project for both of us," he nue to hold ourselves both of us, as well as our fellow democracies - to our core values, including respect for universal human rights, like freedom of religion and belief and freedom of expression, which makes our democracies stronger."

The human rights comments were a part of discussions on a range of topics, which Mr. Blinken characterised as the two countries talking about how they could advance shared security, economic and geopolitical goals.

Arrival of foreign tourists took big hit in 2021, data show

The COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting restrictions saw foreign tourist arrivals in India dip by 44.5% in 2021. While in 2020, 2.74 million foreign tourists had visited India, in 2021, the number was 1.52 million.

According to the India Tourism Statistics 2022, released here on Tuesday by Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankar, the arrival of NRIs, however, increased by 52.6% in 2021 compared with 2020.

In 2021, the top 15 countries from which foreign tourists arrived in India included the U.S., the U.K., Bangladesh, Canada, Nepal, Afghanistan and Australia.

These nations accounted for nearly 81% of foreign While in 2020, 2.74 million foreign tourists visited India, in 2021, the number was 1.52 million

tourist arrivals in India last

year. The report goes on to say that air travel was the most favoured mode of travel for foreign tourists with 87.5% opting for it.

Interestingly, the number of Indian nationals departing the country saw a rise in 2021 as compared to 2020. In 2021, 8.55 million Indian nationals departed the country as compared with 7.29 million in 2020 a 7.3% increase.

The UAE was the top destination for Indians in 2021, followed by the U.S., Qatar, Oman and the U.K.



The Pakistan Foreign Minister did not allude to this in his remarks. Mr. Blinken said he had also asked Pakistan "to engage China on some of the important issues of debt relief and restructure so that Pakistan can more quickly recover from the floods".

They also discussed commitments to democracy and upholding freedom or religion and belief, Mr. Blinken said. "We continue to work closely on counterterrorism issues," Mr. Blinken said., adding the U.S. and Pakistan have a "shared stake" in Afghanistan's future. "We've had our differences; that's no secret," he said.

However, Pakistan and the U.S. shared a common objective, as per Mr. Blinken, of a stable, peaceful future for Afghanistan and "for those across the broader region". The Secretary said the two countries would work together to support the human rights of Afghans, particularly women and girls.

Iran protest death toll tops 75 as govt. doubles down

More than 75 people have died in Iran's crackdown on 11 nights of unrest sparked by the death of Mahsa Amini, a rights group said, as Western nations pile pressure on the Islamic republic to end the violence.

The Iranian authorities' official death toll has remained at 41 since Saturday, including several members of the security forces.

Protesters took to the streets again on Monday night, as they have every night since Amini's death on September 16 following her arrest for allegedly breaching the country's strict rules on hijab headscarves, witnesses said.



Russia's proxies claim victory in annexation elections in Ukraine

Kremlin-installed authorities were already claiming victory on Tuesday in annexation votes in Ukrainian regions under Russian as Moscow warned it could use nuclear weapons to defend the territories

Ukraine and its allies have denounced the socalled referendums as a sham and said the West would never recognise the results of the ballots that have dramatically ratcheted up the stakes of Russia's

seven-month invasion. "It's already clear that the vast majority of people supported the issue of secession from Ukraine and joining Russia," Vladimir Saldo, the Moscow-appointed head of the Russian-held Kherson region, said on social media.

Election officials in Moscow said voters casting their ballots in Russia had overwhelmingly backed annexation, while authorities in Kherson and another Russian-occupied re-Zaporizhzhia, gion, showed an initial 87% and 92% backing for the move.

"Saving people in the territories where this referendum is taking place... is the focus of the attention of our entire society and of the entire country," Russian President Vladimir Putin said earlier during a televised meeting officials.

'Radical' implications

His spokesman Dmitry Peskov meanwhile said the votes would have "radical" legal implications and that the so-called referendums "will also have consequences for security", referring to Moscow's threats to use nuclear weapons to defend its territory.

Ukrainian Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba however doubled down on Kyiv's promise to push out Russian forces from its country, saying the votes "would not have any influence" on the battlefield.

Torrent Pharmaceuticals Ltd. will buy 100% of Curatio Healthcare (I) Pvt. Ltd. for ₹2,000 crore to strengthen its presence in the fast-growing dermatology segment.

The consideration includes ₹115 crore in cash and cash equivalents in the acquired business, indicating an enterprise value of ₹1,885 crore, Torrent Pharma said in a release. Curatio has operations in India, Nepal, Sri Lanka and Philippines. Curatio, which posted a revenue of ₹224 crore for FY22, has a portfolio of more than 50 brands in the cosmetic-dermatology segment.

Moody's sees Quad lifting India's trade, investment flows

Rating firm flags country's 'relatively protectionist' approach, regulatory and infrastructure constraints as key determinants of extent of gains

ndia's membership of the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue will help it tap greater trade and investment flows as economic ties deepen among members seeking to cut their reliance on China, but India's protectionist stance and 'weak' busiclimate could constrain these gains, Moody's Investors Service said on Tuesday.

"India is poised to become a growing destination market for goods from the other Quad countries, including commodities, machinery and chemicals," the rating agency said in a note on geopolitical risks stemming from the Quad alliance. "The U.S. and Japan will continue to be major sources of foreign direct investment (FDI) to India in services, telecommunications and software, while Australia's presence will grow as a result of a free-trade agreement with India," it added.

Trade and investment gains would accrue to India, Moody's observed, adding that regulatory and infrastructure constraints, however, remained. The magnitude of the trade flow shifts would also depend on improvements in India's business climate and the level of investment

attractiveness, which 'remained weak' compared with that of other Asia Pacific and Quad economies.

"India also stands out as a relatively protectionist market... reflected in its high weighted average import tariff," Moody's said.

Still, as economies diversify production of critical products and technologies, the Quad would continue to drive some long-term supply-chain shifts toward Southeast Asia and India, it forecast.

"These shifts may include greater Australian exports of commodities including copper, energy and agricultural goods to these economies. Financial services companies in the U.S., Japan and Australia will benefit from the shifts, which will also support India's industrial and capital market development."

India stood to benefit from Quad-related supply chain shifts by raising trade with member economies and diversifying sources of imports, Moody's said.

"For India, the costs of pivoting from China toward Quad members as priority markets for trade growth will be relatively low, given that only a small share of its exports currently go to China. As reflected in its reluctance to join the RCEP trade agreement, India is keen to reduce its dependence on imports from China while expanding its market access to Australia, Japan and the U.S.," Moody's said.

"A lack of cohesion between Quad members... exemplified by India opting out of the" IPEF trade pillar, may also hurt its ability to find common strategic ground, the firm averred.

Seth allays concerns over forex reserves

Economic Affairs Secretary Ajay Seth on Tuesday dismissed concerns over depletion of forex reserves as "overblown" and said India had fairly large reserves to tide over the current situation.

Foreign exchange reserves were down for a seventh continuous week, dropping to \$545.65 billion on September 16.

The reserves, which have been dipping as the central bank continued to deploy the kitty to defend the rupee amid pressure caused by global developments, had declined by \$2.23 billion to \$550.87 billion in the previous week.

"There has been a de-



pletion as inflows have come down and trade deficit is higher... I don't see this as a concern, India has fairly large reserves to tide over this situation," Mr. Seth said.

After closing at a a record low at 81.67 against the dollar on Monday, the rupee recovered to 81.53 on Tuesday.

In sport, what is legal is not necessarily considered moral, and what is admirable not necessarily worthy of emulation.

At Lord's, Deepti Sharma ran out England's Charlie Dean at the non-striker's end for backing up too far, an act that came to be known as 'mankading' (after Vinoo Mankad; when the Indian allrounder ran out Bill Brown thus in 1947-48, rival captain Don Bradman had no issues with it).

Then in the Duleep Trophy final, West Zone skipper Ajinkya Rahane sent teammate Yashasvi Jaiswal off the field briefly for sledging the South batsmen. There are good reasons for applauding Rahane's action, but should it become regular practice, and why was a substitute allowed?

Set of tricks

Every sport has a set of tricks. You can get away with some without causing comment, but be marked when you indulge in others. Not walking despite knowing you are out is accepted (but with the Deci-

sion Review System not so much of an issue now).

In the old days, Geoff Boycott, when hit on the back foot and thus a leg before candidate would sometimes rub a spot high on his front leg to throw the umpire.

The motto seemed to be: it is up to the umpire to get it right, the player's job is to confuse him. The professional foul in football or basketball is a ploy to gain time, space or break the opposition's rhythm, and although frowned upon is accepted as a part of the give-and-take of sport.

Sledging has developed into an art form; yet, all noise ends as the bowler approaches – this rule is adhered to religiously. There is a thus-far-and-nofurther element to sledg-Sports are ruled as

much by convention as by laws. There are on-field penalties if the latter are breached, but the penalties if you breach the former are usually delivered off field. Despite the MCC (custodians of cricket's laws) promptly asserting that Sharma's act was legal, there will continue to be discomfort.

It is not so much about the implication of the act which took some of the gloss away from the final game of one of the greats, Jhulan Goswami – but the act itself.

One side argues that what Sharma did was expressly allowed by the laws and that is all there is to it.

The other side (usually with a higher average age) says the spirit is on a par with the law if not occupying a higher chair.

The former argue that winning is everything, a philosophy that drives society as a whole, so why should cricket be different?

Fantasy

We put into sport our passions because it is a way of rescuing it from its essenmeaninglessness. Cricket cannot be a mere reflection of society but must aspire higher. It is fantasy, and in a fantasy we must aim for the ideal. That is why we inject cricket with such moral pur-

Indians warned the batter and told the umpires, Sharma says, but England's Heather Knight says this didn't happen.

A writer in *Cricinfo* has worked out that Dean had taken significant starts before the ball was delivered on 72 previous occasions, and was finally run out the 73rd time.

One sharp practice being cancelled out by another might suggest justice has been served, but such things come down to individual choice. Some players have suggested that there should be no gap between what is legal and what belongs to the spirit, but it is in this gap that character is revealed.

It would be interesting to know how Indian supporters would have reacted had the roles been reversed and had England pulled off a similar runout.

Unusual measure

Rahane's response to sledging was unusual. He played a lot of his international cricket in an Indian team that was uber-aggressive and sledged the opposition, a practice that clearmade uncomfortable. When he captained in the last series in Australia which India won, there was a marked cooling down of emotions.

Youngsters tend to believe that they have to hone their sledging skills to fit into modern cricket's ethos. Those who are misfits in the sledging department are often under pressure to

Even a gentle fast bowler like Jasprit Bumrah indulged in England last year. It is down to the captain. If he encourages, or indeed demands it, then the team obliges.

Jaiswal has probably learnt his lesson, but I can't help thinking that Rahane, a man of subtlety and finesse might have handled this transgression without embarrassing a colleague publicly. Perhaps he tried and failed. Still, would a senior player have been told off thus?

Jaiswal is just 20, and might carry the scar of the public reprimand at a time when he is in the running for higher honours. His 265 in the second innings has brought him that much closer too.



The NASA spacecraft-asteroid collision

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What is the 'kick' method which was used to deflect an asteroid headed towards earth? How can the technique be further utilised for space mining technologies?

EXPLAINER

The story so far:

n September 27, at 4:44 am IST, the DART (Double Asteroid Redirection Test) spacecraft collided with the space rock Dimorphos (just 160 metres wide). NASA has confirmed that the collision of the auto-rickshaw sized 600 kilogram weighing DART, on the football stadium-sized Dimorphos, about five billion kilogram in mass (orbiting around the 780 metres wide primary asteroid Didymos), has deflected the trajectory of the pair of space rocks. This kinetic impact technique, which appears as the climax of Hollywood sci-fi movies like Deep Impact and Armageddon, is also known as the 'kick' method. It could one day save humanity from a potential cataclysmic collision by safely deflecting a killer asteroid on its course towards earth. It could also fuel space mining technologies and unleash the space economy in decades to come.

What are asteroids?

Around a construction site, bits and pieces of leftover bricks, unused steel rods, and emptied paint canisters are usually strewn. Likewise, leftover materials from the formation of the sun, earth and planets, through the accretion and agglomeration of giant gas and rocks, are scattered as comets, asteroids and meteoroids in the solar system. Some of these cross their path and collide with earth from time to time, resulting in a spectacular meteor shower. Most rocks are so small that they burn up completely in the atmosphere due to frictional heating. If they are large enough, the charred piece falls through as a meteorite. The falling piece from a meteoroid 140 metres wide or more will be capable of completely wiping out a city like Chennai. The impact would be devastating if it was one or more kilometres wide.

Neither the plot nor NASA's Planetary Defense Coordination Office, made famous by the blockbuster Netflix movie Don't Look Up is imaginary. About 66 million years ago, an asteroid about 10-15 kms struck earth. The tsunami, volcanic eruptions and thick dust clouds ensuing from the blow decimated dinosaurs and nearly 75% of all species. What happened in the past can occur in the future. The chances of a giant asteroid striking earth are small; however, if it did occur, the devastation would be cataclysmic, wiping out the entire human civilisation. While dinosaurs were mute spectators, humans can prepare themselves to face the imminent threat. NASA tracks and keeps a close watch on the nearly 26,115 asteroids whose orbits are dangerously close to earth.

What was NASA's mission?

NASA, to put it simply, undertook the 'kick' technique. Compared to the massive Dimorphos, DART is a tiny Goliath. Yet crashing at a breakneck speed of 23,760 kilometres per hour, the momentum is adequate to slash the angular momentum of Dimorphos, making it speed up and move closer to Didymos. All of these reduce the orbital period and the time taken for the moonlet to go around the primary asteroid. The pair's trajectory is thus deflected as the net result of these dynamics. Consider it like this: a fast-moving moped slamming into a truck is sure to undergo a massive crash and burn, yet will veer the massive truck a bit. This is the essence of the 'kick' technique.


The extent of the trajectory change depends on the context. Compare throwing a ball against a solid wall and a sand pit. If

the Dimorphos were solid, the crashing craft would make a dent on its surface and skim a tiny bit of its angular momentum, reducing the orbital time by about 75 seconds. However, close-up images transmitted by the DART moments before the fatal collision indicate that Dimorphos is more like a pile of rubble loosely held by gravity. If true, the impact will eject a cascade of debris, each piece carrying away a bit of momentum and energy. And as a net result, the asteroid will suffer a considerable loss. It will speed up more, and the orbit will become nearer to Didymos. The orbital period will then reduce by as much as 10 minutes.

What has been the impact assessment?

The DART craft carried a high-resolution

DRACO (Didymos Reconnaissance and Asteroid Camera for Optical navigation) camera to observe the collision and its consequences. The close-up images until its fatal crash are being analysed. In addition, like a kangaroo with a baby in its pouch, a tiny toaster-sized Italian Space Agency-built Light Italian CubeSat for Imaging of Asteroids (LICIACube) took a piggyback ride with the DART.

The CubeSat was released and deployed two weeks before the impact. Hovering 50 kilometres from the asteroid, the two cameras aboard the CubeSat have captured the plume of the debris ejected by the collision. At 11 million kilometres, the asteroids appear like a blip of dot even through the best of telescopes. As they waltz around each other, once in 11 hours and 55 minutes, Dimorphos and Didymos line up, eclipsing one another. The total brightness of the pair darkens when Dimorphos passes in front of and behind Didymos.

months observing the periodic change in the brightness using the telescopes to tease out the altered orbital period. All this data is still in process and will help finetune the technology.

What are the other possibilities of this technique?

At the heels of NASA, China is set to deflect a 40m diametre earth-crossing asteroid called 2020 PN1 sometime in 2026. While ostensibly the drive comes from the desire to protect earth from killer asteroids, perhaps the lure of space mining lurks behind. Mining rare earth elements comes with a high environmental cost. In the coming years, the penalty for polluting could make space mining economically viable. If one can tug a mineral-rich asteroid near the Moon or establish a space mining factory between the orbits of earth and Mars, precious mineral resources needed for decades could be easily sourced. The 'kick' technique that deflects asteroids can then be used to move a small asteroid into a convenient position for space mining. Now shelved, NASA's Asteroid Redirect Mission (ARM) aimed at precisely this by bringing a 20-tonne space rock near earth to study and mine. In a way, the DART mission is also part of this

For developing green energy technologies - electric vehicles, solar panels, wind turbines, and energy storage devices and ushering in the low carbon economy of the future, rare earth elements such as yttrium, niobium, rhodium, palladium, osmium, iridium and scandium are critical. They are short in supply, and asteroid mining, it is believed, could solve the rare earth supply problem.

From the robotic Soviet Luna 16 in the 1970s to U.S. Apollo missions and China's first lunar sample-return mission, Chang'e 5 – all have brought back lunar soil. NASA's Stardust spacecraft returned a canister full of dust from comet Wild-2 captured by an aerogel-based sample collector in 2004. Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA)'s Hayabusa 1 to 25143 Itokawa, the Hayabusa 2 to 162173 Ryugu, and NASA's OSIRIS-Rex to near-earth asteroid Bennu are missions to extract and return samples from asteroids.

On September 27, at 4:44 am IST, the DART (Double Asteroid Redirection Test) spacecraft collided with the space rock Dimorphos (just 160 metres wide). NASA has confirmed that the collision of the auto-rickshaw sized 600 kilogram weighing DART, on the football stadium-sized Dimorphos, about five billion kilogram in mass (orbiting around the 780 metres wide primary asteroid Didymos), has deflected the trajectory of the pair of space rocks.

The momentum of DART

crashing at a breakneck speed of 23,760 kilometres per hour, is adequate to slash the angular momentum of Dimorphos, making it speed up and move closer to Didymos. All of these reduce the orbital period and the time taken for the moonlet to go around the trajectory is thus deflected as the net result of these dynamics.

On reservations for EWS: a test for law and justice

While in most cases the Supreme Court's own precedent provides principled answers, the challenges made to the 103rd constitutional amendment present a more difficult judicial examination than usual

The Supreme Court has reserved its verdict on a batch of pleas challenging the validity of the 103rd constitutional amendment providing 10% reservation to EWS persons in admissions and government jobs. In this article dated July 16, 2019, Suhrith Parthasarathy explains how reservations based on economic status is against the elementary conception of equality guaranteed by the Constitution.

onstitutional challenges are often described as hard cases. This is, however, seldom true. Invariably, disputes possess a simple solution. We can debate over what theories of interpretation to apply and over whether the text of a clause needs to be read literally or in light of its historical background, but in most cases, the Supreme Court's own precedent and commonly accepted legal theories provide an easy enough guide to finding a principled answer. The challenges made to the 103rd constitutional amendment, though, which a two-judge bench of the Supreme Court is slated to hear this month, present a rather more difficult

Here, the issues involved concern mestions both over whether the amendment infringes the extant idea of equality, and over whether that idea is so intrinsic to the Constitution, that departing from it will somehow breach the document's basic structure. The court's answers to these questions will operate not merely within the realm of the law but will also likely have a deep political bearing – for at stake here is the very nature of justice that India's democracy embodies.

The law, which was introduced in January this year, amends Articles 15 and 16 of the Constitution, and grants to government the power to provide for reservation in appointments to posts under the state and in admissions to educational institutions to "economically weaker sections [EWS] of citizens". At first blush, this reservation, which can extend up to 10% of the total seats

available, may not appear to impinge on the existing constitutional arrangement. But what it does mandate is a quota that will apply only to citizens other than the classes that are already eligible for reservation. Consequently, persons belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and persons who are not part of the creamy layer of the Other Backward Classes will not be eligible to the seats available under the quota.

According to the petitioners in the Supreme Court, the central hypothesis of the amendment, where reservation is predicated on individual economic status, violates the Constitution's basic structure. In their belief, the law, by providing for affirmative action unmindful of the structural inequalities inherent in India's society, overthrows the prevailing rationale for reservations. In doing so, they argue, the amendment destroys the Constitution's idea of equal opportunity. The Union of India argues that while the Constitution demands equality, it does not confine Parliament to any singular vision. According to it, the power to amend the Constitution must necessarily include a power to decide how to guarantee equal status to all persons.

Meaning and purpose

Omvedt wrote in these pages ("The purpose of reservation - I", March 24, 2000), "the whole history of the struggle for reservation has also been a debate about its very meaning and purpose". When reservations were first introduced by some of the princely states the policy was seen largely as an alleviative measure. For instance, in the princely State of Mysore, where privileged castes had cornered virtually every post available under the government, a system of reservations was introduced denominating communities as "Backward Classes", and providing for them a larger share in the administration. By the time the Constitution was being drafted as a reading of the Constituent Assembly's debates shows us, the rationale for reservations had broadened. The Constitution's framers saw the measure as a promise against prejudice, as a tool to assimilate deprived groups into public life, and as a means of reparation, to compensate persons belonging to those groups for the reprehensible acts of discrimination wrought on them through history. Marc Galanter has called this a compensatory discrimination principle.

Yet, despite the expanded justification, the basic foundational logic for reservations was still predicated on a demand for a fairer and more representative share in political administration. This is demonstrated by R.M. Nalavade's comment in the Constituent Assembly. "Our experience in the provinces, though there are provisions for reservation in the services, is bitter," he said. "Even though the depressed classes are educated and qualified, they are not given chances of employment under the Provincial Governments. Now that we have provided for this in the Constitution itself, there is no fear for the Scheduled castes. According to this clause we can be adequately represented in the provincial as well as in the Central services."

By providing for a more proportionate distribution of the share in administration, the programme of reservations, it was believed, would end at least some of caste-based domination of jobs, particularly of employment in the public sector – a domination that was built over thousands of years, where Dalits and Adivasis were denied access to equal status. As Ms. Omvedt has pointed out, the strategy behind reservations could, therefore, never have involved an attack on pure economic backwardness. The idea was always to disavow caste-monopoly in the public sector.

Theory of iustice

Even when the Constitution's first amendment was introduced in 1951, to allow the state to make special provisions beyond reservations in public employment for "the advancement of any socially and educationally backward classes of citizens, or for the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes", the rationale, as the lawyer Malavika Prasad

has argued, remained constant. Attempts made at the time to categorise individuals on the basis of economic status were expressly rejected. Behind this thinking was a distinctive theory of justice: that by according a greater share in public life to historically disadvantaged groups the relative position of those groups would stand enhanced. No doubt such a policy would not, in and of itself, help eliminate the various inequalities produced by the caste system, but it was believed it would represent a resolute effort to eliminate at least some of the caste-based domination prevailing in society.

Indeed, the policy and the idea of justice that undergirds it have been seen as so indispensable to the Constitution's aims and purposes that the Supreme Court in State of Kerala v. N. M. Thomas (1975) held that reservations based on social and educational backwardness, far from being an exception ought to be seen as an intrinsic facet of the idea of equality.

Unseating equality

It is in departing from this logic that the 103rd amendment unseats the Constitution's code of equality. Pure financial ability is a transient criterion; it doesn't place people into a definite group requiring special privileges. If anything, allowing for reservation on such a principle only further fortifies the ability of powerful castes to retain their positions of authority, by creating an even greater monopolisation of their share in administration. If such an end is indeed the vision, it's difficult to see how the elementary conception of equality guaranteed by the Constitution can continue to survive. Now, no doubt the Supreme Court may, on the face of things, consider Parliament as possessing the nower to altogether dismantle the Constitution's existing idea of equality without simultaneously demolishing the document's basic structure. But, if nothing else, when the court hears the challenges made to the 103rd amendment, it must see the petitioners' arguments as representing a credibly defensible view. The least the court ought to do, therefore, is to refer the case to a constitution bench, given that Article 145(3) mandates such an enquiry on any issue involving a substantial question of law concerning the Constitution's interpretation, and, in the meantime, stay the operation of the amendment until such a bench hears the case fully. Should the court fail to do so the government will surely one day present to it a cruel fait accompli.

Theory of the Malthusian trap

Thomas Malthus' idea has often been cited by environmentalists who argue that a rising human population puts unsustainable pressure on resources

The Malthusian trap or Malthusian check refers to the theory that as the human population grows there is increasing pressure on earth's resources, which in turn acts as a check on the further rise in population. It is named after English economist Thomas Malthus who elaborated on the concept in his 1798 book An Essay on the Principle of Population, which quite famously inspired Charles Darwin. In his book, Malthus argued that while rise in food production in a country can lead to improved living standards for the general population, the benefit is likely to be temporary. This is because, Malthus argued, increasing availability of food would encourage people to have more kids since they could afford to feed them now, thus leading to a rise in the total population and a drop in per capita income levels. Malthus, in other words, believed that there was an inverse relationship between human population and living standards with rising population leading to lower living standards.

Industrial revolution

Malthus' idea has often been cited by modern environmentalists and other social scientists who believe that rising human population puts unsustainable pressure on earth's resources. The per capita income of countries remained fairly low and largely stable for many centuries until the modern age. In the pre-modern age, whenever there was a rise in food production due to whatever reason, this caused per capita income to rise for a while as long as population levels remained stable. However, the population of the country increased quite quickly which ensured that per capita income returned to its historical trend. Whenever food production dropped on the other hand, there was famine which caused the death of a large number of people. The drop in human population continued until the country's per capita income rose to subsistence levels. Either way, resource constraints kept a check on human population.

The industrial revolution that happened in the 18th and 19th centuries is seen as a landmark event that broke the historical relationship between human population and living standards. It witnessed the rising use of man-made technology, which made sure that human beings could produce more output in the form of goods and services for each unit of the earth's resource that they exploited. In other words, human productivity rose massively as a result of the rise of technology.

What critics say

Critics of the Malthusian trap believe that the industrial revolution decisively refuted Malthus as human population levels and living standards have risen in tandem ever since the event. In other words, according to critics, there may be no strict inverse correlation between population growth and the living standards of people. As long as human beings can find ways to use earth's resources more efficiently, their population can grow without compromising their living standards even in the long-term. In fact, some argue that as human population rises, the chances of breakthrough innovations happening rise manifold as there would be more human minds working on solving humanity's problems.


