Scheme of valuation:

Section A

1. What are the elements of social work profession, define professional meaning
Scheme of evaluation: Familiarity with meaning / definition of social work 'Helping the helpless to help themselves and IFSW definition. The elements of SW profession such as SW knowledge, scientific training, SW values and ethics, public acceptance, SW associations, SW council, etc
2. Outline the history of social work; specify the contributions of Savitri Bai Phule to social work profession.
Scheme of evaluation: Familiarity with history of social work and contributions of Savitribai Phule specially education for dalits and women, shudra and atishudra to acquire political power, eradication of caste system, etc
3. Give a brief note on the *methods* of social work and Specify few techniques being used in the practice
Scheme of evaluation: Knowledge of six methods of social work such as social case work, Social group work and community organization as basic methods and social action, social research and social work administration. The techniques such as listening, speaking, reasoning, questioning, probing, counseling, etc.
4. Explain the difference between ideological and methodical concepts being used in social work practice
Scheme of evaluation: Familiarity with ideological concepts such as social welfare, development, empowerment, human rights, social justice, conscientisation, and methodical concepts such as meaning of concept, principles, process, strategies, approach, social service, social reform, etc.
5. Present the humanistic elements that professional social work recognizes; describe humanist elements practiced in a religion that like most
Scheme of evaluation: Students familiarity with humanistic elements such as equity, equality, equal rights, equal share, equal opportunity, non discrimination on the basis of caste, class, gender, place of birth, vocation, etc.
6. Highlight the emerging fields in social work, give a brief note on the strengths & limitations of Corporate foundations

Scheme of evaluation: Students familiarity with different fields of social work such as women & child development, disabled welfare, labour welfare, medical and psychiatry, Human Resources development, specially emerging field Corporate Foundations / Social Responsibility and its impact on the weaker sections of the society.
