BENGALURU: Bollywood actor Shah Rukh Khan on Thursday faced the brunt of a hate campaign against him on Twitter. Arun Yadav, BJP's State In-Charge of Technology Information Department in Haryana, allegedly led this campaign

#BoycottShahRukhKhan in relation to the remarks made by the actor.

A video compilation of the actor went viral where he made statements claiming that Pakistan cricketers are the best T20 players in the world. Pictures of him and the Pakistan Prime Minister, Imran Khan was trending on Twitter. Arun Yadav urged his followers to boycott Shah Rukh Khan in multiple tweets using islamophobic terms accusing the actor of supporting Pakistan.

Netizens took to Twitter to criticize him. "There is intolerance, there is extreme intolerance. Time to show Pakistan lover @iamsrk some Intolerance him boycotting and continuing his streak of consecutive flops on the box office. ," a user tweeted.
