UN Chief observes 2nd 'World Clean Air Day'

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, Guterres urged the citizens to work together to clean the polluted air that leads to around 7 million premature deaths each year. On the occasion of 'World Clean Air Day', Guterres took to Twitter and said that at least 9 out of 10 people breathe polluted air.

"As many as 9 out of 10 people breathe polluted air, leading to some 7 million premature deaths each year," he tweeted.

He added, "This number could double by 2050 if we don't act decisively now. Let's work together to clean the air that we breathe so we may protect people & planet #WorldCleanAirDay."

Climate activist, Aditya Dubey also tweeted, "So many children breathe toxic air every day! We can all : work together to change this! Join me and become #HawaKeRakshak Blue heart #HealthyAirHealthyPlanet."

This year's theme is 'Healthy Air, Healthy Planet', thereby emphasizing the effects of air pollution on human health during the Covid-19 pandemic.
