The Ministry of Health and family Welfare reiterates commitment to expand the of Covid-19 vaccination by continuing to supply more vaccines to states and Union Territories free of cost.

More than 63.09 crore vaccine doses have been provided to States/UTs so far as per the release by the ministry. Apart from this, more than 4.87 crore balance and unutilized vaccine doses are still available with States/ UTs with 21.76 Lakh doses in the pipeline.

"The Union Government will procure and supply for free of cost 75% of the vaccines being produced by the vaccine manufacturers in the country to states and UTs," stated the release.

"It is great that the government is continuing to give vaccines free of cost," said Shammi Khan, a student of Bengaluru City University. phase of universalization of COVID-19 vaccination started from June 2021. But she also expressed doubt about the safety of children. "This is not the correct time to open. We should wait and observe how things develop during the third wave and then take the decision. When we have waited for all these days why not wait another two or three months," she added.
