Read the extract and answer the following questions in about 100-150 words each: (3X10=30)

The pitting of fantasy and realist writing against each other corresponded with the development of separate literatures for children and adults in the 18th and 19th centuries: the serious realist novel was for adult male readers, whereas fantasy and romance were relegated to the readership of women and children.

- 1. Comment on the gendered segregation of children's writing as hinted in the above passage. Illustrate with examples from texts that you have encountered growing up.
- 2. Un Lun Dun is overtly read as a fantastical narrative. Comment on how the text negotiates the complex relationship between realism and fantasy in children's literature.
- In Centuries of Childhood Philippe Aries makes the controversial claim that "in medieval societies childhood did not exist and that childhood is a modern invention." Evaluate how this claim affects the way we see children as a category of readers.
